

First of all, the easiest way to log on is via the Web at

[www.pollybutte.net](http://www.pollybutte.net)

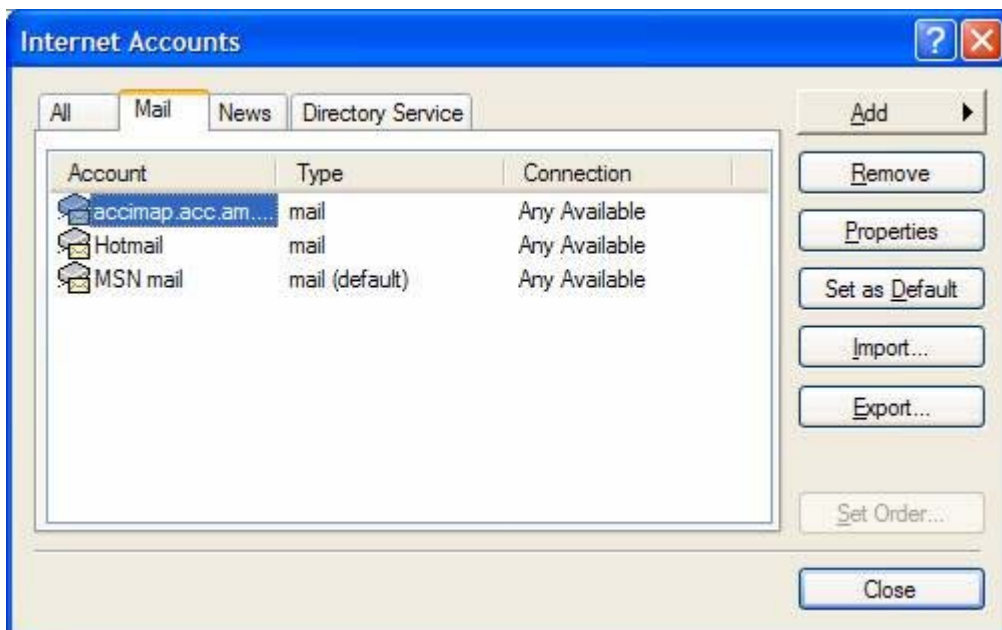
Click on the client webmail link. At the login prompt enter <your name>@pollybutte.net and the password to get into the inbox. Once you have logged on, you can then use the Web tools to view, edit and send your mail.

Try this first to establish that the logon and password are correct before trying to set up Outlook or Outlook Express mail client.

### **Outlook Express via Windows XP:**

Under the Tools menu select **Accounts**

Select the Mail tab and then click the **Add** button



Enter your name and click the **Next >** button



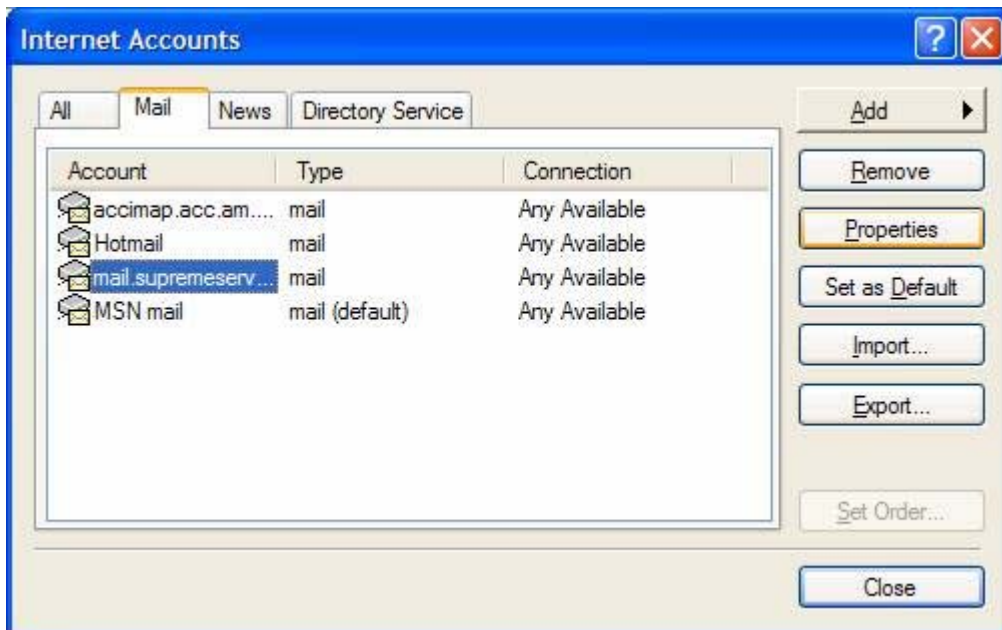

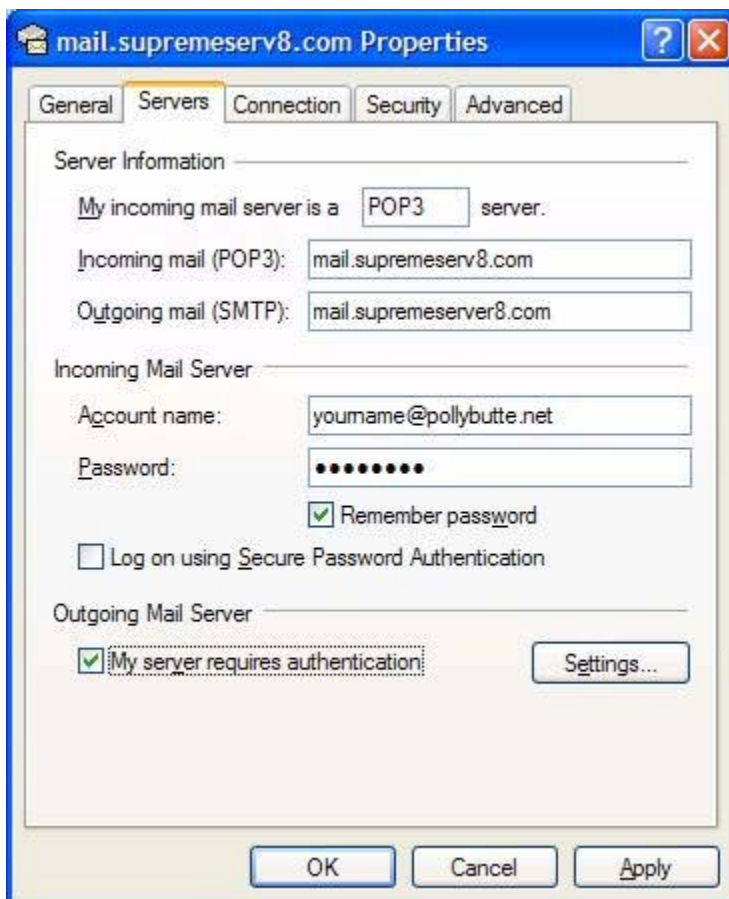

## Outlook via Windows XP:

Open Outlook and click the Tools menu. Select E-mail accounts.  
Click on the radio button for "Add a new e-mail account" and click **Next >**





Select POP3 and click **Next >**




